

LEARNED OUTCOMES * GRADE 4

Focus: MORALITY

THEMES:

Student will be able to exhibit an understanding of the following:

- God, our Creator, is merciful and forgiving
- God is always with us.
- God gives us grace, the gift of God's presence, and life
- God shares his life and love with us. We call this sanctifying grace. God helps us live as children of God. We call this actual grace.
- God calls us to love and respect ourselves and others
- Jesus teaches us to love and respect ourselves and others
- Jesus teaches us how to live according to the beatitudes and the commandments
- Mary is the Mother of God. She is the Mother of Jesus, the Son of God
- Evil spreads through the selfish acts of people
- The Holy Spirit guides us to choose good rather than evil
- We receive God's grace and the strength of the Holy Spirit in the sacraments
- Liturgy means "public work", or the work of the people. We celebrate liturgy the whole year and call this the liturgical year.
- The gifts of the Holy Spirit are: wisdom, understanding, right judgment, courage, knowledge, reverence, wonder, and awe
- The fruits of the Holy Spirit are: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, unselfishness, faithfulness, gentleness, self control, modesty, continence, and chastity
- The ten Commandments*, the Great Commandment*, the Beatitudes*, and corporal and spiritual works of mercy are our guides for living the way of Jesus.

PRAYERS

THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

5. Simon helps Jesus carry the cross.
6. Veronica wipes the face of Jesus.
7. Jesus falls the second time.
8. Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem.
9. Jesus falls the third time.
10. Jesus is stripped of his clothes.
11. Jesus is nailed to the cross.
12. Jesus dies on the cross.
13. Jesus is taken down from the cross.
14. Jesus is buried in the tomb.
