

# LEARNED OUTCOMES \* GRADE 6

## Focus: THE HEBREW SCRIPTURES

### THEMES:

- God creates out of love
- God invites God's people into relationship
- God invites God's people to freedom
- God established a covenant with God's Chosen People
- Jesus proclaims the coming of God's Kingdom
- Jesus is the fulfillment of the Hebrew Scriptures
- The Holy Spirit is always present and active in the lives of God's people
- The Old Testament (Hebrew Scriptures) is the record of faith of the Ancient Hebrews, God's Chosen People; Abraham is the Father of the Hebrew People.
- The Old Testament reveals that God has always been present and active in the lives of His people: God has always acted to save His people; God invites His people to freedom; God revealed His name, YAHWEH, to Moses; Moses led the Chosen People from slavery in Egypt to freedom in the promised land; God chooses prophets from among His people to speak God's word against injustice and suffering; The prophets remind the people of God's faithful love, and of the covenant
- Sacramental actions of the Church originated in Jewish rituals: Anointing with oil; purifying with water; laying on of hands; sharing a meal
- Jesus gave us the Eucharist at a Passover meal. Jesus' life, passion, and resurrection are called the Paschal Mystery, which comes from the Hebrew word "Passover".
- The Bible is God's word to us in the words of its human authors
- The Bible probes the mysteries of life, goodness and evil, justice and injustice, suffering and death
- The Psalms are the prayers of God's people
- Laws, such as the Ten Commandments, show what a community values, loves and believes

## STATIONS OF THE CROSS

1. Jesus is condemned to death.
2. Jesus accepts his cross.
3. Jesus falls the first time.
4. Jesus meets his mother.
5. Simon helps Jesus carry the cross.
6. Veronica wipes the face of Jesus.
7. Jesus falls the second time.
8. Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem.
9. Jesus falls the third time.
10. Jesus is stripped of his clothes.
11. Jesus is nailed to the cross.
12. Jesus dies on the cross.
13. Jesus is taken down from the cross.
14. Jesus is buried in the tomb.

## ROSARY

Catholics pray the rosary to honor Mary and remember the important events in the life of Jesus and Mary. There are 15 mysteries of the rosary. The word *mystery* means "the wonderful things God has done for us."

We begin praying the rosary by praying the Apostles' Creed, the Lord's Prayer and the Hail Mary. Each mystery of the rosary is prayed by praying the Lord's Prayer once, the Hail Mary 10 times, and the Glory Prayer once. When we have finished the last mystery, we pray—Hail, Holy Queen.
